# Summer STEAM Academy 2022 at SUNY Broome

SUNY Broome has welcomed over 140 seventh through tenth grade students from local school districts who participated in Summer STEAM Academy 2022 from July 18 to July 28. This two-week hands-on program engaged students in problem- & project-based learning around STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Mathematics) through the design cycle processes.

Educators from Broome-Tioga BOCES and the local school districts along with our own SUNY Broome professors, Dr. Rob Congdon (Chemistry), Professor Paul Cartie (Mathematics), and Dr. Paul Fiacco (Mathematics), teamed-up with students to explore and develop fun, interactive, hands-on projects with real-world applications. Some of the challenges included designing, building, and testing cardboard castles, shields, helmets, trebuchet-launchers, balsa wood towers, butterfly-houses, stop-motion animations, and more.

The goal to inspire a more innovative, creative, and critical thinking mindset is conveyed by Paul Cartie when he shared, “I really enjoyed working with middle school students through the design process of creating their own musical instruments. Watching them implement their own ideas was very cool to be a part of. We had some participants attempt classic instruments like guitars and flutes, but in every group, there were students that invented their own unique instruments.”

BT-BOCES Summer STEAM Academy and SUNY Broome provided a collaborative environment for students to express themselves as they continue to build a STEAM foundation for success in 2022 and beyond.



# Collaboration Between Binghamton University, SUNY Broome, and Regional Partners Await Notification of EDA Phase 2 Award

SUNY Broome's campus is abuzz with excitement as we celebrate the collaborative achievement of being selected as a finalist in the "1 Billion Build Back Better Regional Challenge" awarded through the U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA). Under the overarching title of "The Research Foundation for the State University of New York," Binghamton University, SUNY Broome, and other area partners have joined forces to develop the New Energy, New York initiative, which will transform the Southern Tier of New York into a lithium-based battery development and manufacturing hub.

In the wake of the pandemic induced financial downturn, the Economic Development Administration (EDA) set out to reinvigorate regional economies through community led projects. Via American Rescue Plan funding, the EDA launched their most expansive revitalization initiative, the "Build Back Better Regional Challenge," which tasked local communities to create sources of innovation and workforce development for their region.

A team from Binghamton University saw the EDA's call to action and connected with community partners, including SUNY Broome, to submit an application.

Over 500 communities from across the nation also submitted proposals that delineated their plans to revamp their respective regions' economic development. 60 finalists were selected to split a \$30 million planning grant that is to be used to further develop the proposal in order to be considered for "Phase 2." If The Research Foundation for the State University of New York's proposal is selected for "Phase 2", additional funding ranging from \$25 to \$100 million will be granted to develop a lithium-based battery manufacturing center to fulfill battery demands domestically.

SUNY Broome is truly delighted by the finalist designation and is eager to implement our contributions to the collaborative effort. "We are so happy to be part of this exciting opportunity for our region. SUNY Broome will bring our expertise in developing educational pathways and workforce development to ensure that the proposed lithium-ion gigafactory will have a skilled and competent workforce to meet the clean energy needs of our nation," shared Dr. Penny Kelly Ed.D., Vice President for Academic Affairs.

In preparation for "Phase 2," SUNY Broome is working to determine the labor needs that will be required for such a massive manufacturing center. The EDA encourages that a portion of the \$500,000.00 grant funding be allocated for consultations to assist in identifying underserved populations who could fill the workforce gaps in the pipeline for this growing cluster. Senator Chuck Schumer has been overwhelmingly supportive of this proposal and is particularly dedicated to assisting with the creation of hundreds of high-paying jobs for the Southern Tier region.

While the aggressive timeline for deploying this New Energy, New York initiative may be daunting at times, the team at SUNY Broome is poised to be an active member of the coalition.

Director of Workforce Development, Danielle Britton, is ready to connect the pieces.

"We have developed some core, non-credit classes that align perfectly with the mechatronics and clean energy needs for this initiative. Ideally, we would like students to stack their non-credit classes, into a mechatronics certification, into a full degree, all while working in industry. We have the framework for curricula at the various levels and job classifications and are honored to be included in developing and delivering a clean energy educational system for the community," said Britton.

The term mechatronics may be unfamiliar to some, but it is the key combination of interdisciplinary engineering sciences and skill sets that perfectly aligns with the manufacturing of batteries. SUNY Broome's mechatronics certificate is a hands-on blend of courses in manufacturing, mechanical, and electrical engineering. Students will develop the skills necessary to work with modern machinery/systems in a clean and efficient way.

If you are interested in being part of the Southern Tier's groundbreaking history as a lithium-based battery manufacturing empcenter, consider joining SUNY Broome's first Mechatronics certificate cohort. SUNY Broome is still accepting applications for the fall 2022 semester. The application is FREE and takes about ten minutes to complete.

The Research Foundation for the State University of New York coalition has submitted their followup proposal to be considered for Phase 2 of the EDA's challenge and hopes to be notified in late summer of the final decision.

The group made the 4+ hour trek to the eruption under the guidance of the Icelandic Search and Rescue authorities to safely view the eruption. This was truly a once in a lifetime opportunity for these students and made possible with generous support from the Broome Community College Foundation.

Dr. Kevin Drumm, President of SUNY Broome, began his address by explaining that this 2022-23 academic year will be one that will forever remain very dear to his heart, but be bittersweet as well. After serving as the College's 7th President for the past 12.5 years, President Drumm plans to retire in July of 2023.

Dr. Drumm took time to briefly reflect on his tenure at the College and marvel at how much the campus has changed. In 12.5 years, 11 buildings have either been built, knocked down, or significantly renovated. On an academic front, SUNY Broome's faculty and staff have added new programs and have created educational opportunities through travel and other service initiatives. The College worked diligently to adapt its curriculum delivery methods to allow students to receive a SUNY Broome education on campus, online, or through a combination of both.

When Dr. Drumm arrived at SUNY Broome over a decade ago, he often encouraged the campus community with his adage "continuous improvement, continuous innovation." He is bringing that motto back and highlighted areas to actively address this upcoming academic year, including capitalizing on partnerships with both regional high schools and public and private four year colleges.

Brenda Dawe, Associate Professor/Chairperson of Music and Theater Arts, introduced the featured musical performer. Environmental Science student, Emily Dimock, performed "Think of Me" from Andrew Lloyd Webber's Phantom of the *Opera*. Brenda Dawe proudly enumerated Emily Dimock's many talents and accomplishments, as both a musician and as an athlete, and reminded her colleagues to encourage their students to engage in extracurricular activities.

"If you have students in your classes like Emily, please send them to me. If we have learned anything from these past few years, it's that students need outlets to maintain overall mental health," shared Dawe.

Dr. Penny Kelly returned to the podium and highlighted the accomplishments of the previous year that will launch the College into the upcoming academic semester. Thanks to the collaborative efforts of many faculty and staff, major strides were made in the academic master plan including the implementation of a new advising model, major progress with Guided Pathways, and securing an overwhelmingly impressive amount of grant funding to support each academic division.

Other presenters included Dr. Andrew Haggerty (CAI), Erin Marulli (CA), and Brittney Richardson (COI) who represented Shared Governance. They announced that all Shared Governance meetings will be conducted both in-person and via Zoom.

Dr. Carol Ross-Scott, Vice President for Student Development & Chief Diversity Officer, expressed the importance of physical and mental wellness for both SUNY Broome's students and employees. She also reminded the campus community that over 250 new students will be arriving at the Student Village on Saturday, August 27th and that move-in volunteers would be genuinely appreciated.

Dave Ligeikis, representing Campus Operations, provided a comprehensive recap of the tremendous work done by the facilities team. This recap included on-going initiatives and upcoming major projects. In the past 16 months, over 1,800 work order requests have been completed by the maintenance and facilities teams.

Cathy R. Williams, Executive Director of BCC Foundation, concluded the assembly by highlighting the just under 1.8 million dollars of overall financial support raised for the College for student support for scholarships, campus activities, faculty development, and for capital projects. Cathy shared her genuine and constant appreciation for the faculty and staff and encouraged her colleagues to participate in the Foundation's "Very Inspiring Person" campaign, which recognizes fellow employees for their hard work and dedication to SUNY Broome.


The SUNY Broome Library would like to welcome all new and returning students to campus. The Library staff are here to support you in your studies and answer any questions you may have. Here is a note about some changes in the library and a few services that we offer.

## Collection consolidation

Over the summer, we consolidated the reference collection with the circulating collection. Now all the books are on the second floor of the library. We hope that this will make locating books a little easier, as well as increase their use. It also opened up space for more study tables for quiet group or individual work.

## Reserve a study room

The library has 9 rooms which can be reserved for individual or group study. Students can reserve rooms online with this self-serve form. There is an Info button for each room which explains the room capacity and equipment available, and a grid where you can schedule times to use the rooms. These rooms are great for students who need to attend online classes from campus, and for students who need a space for group study.



## Ask a Librarian 24/7

Library reference help is available around the clock, 7 days a week, through the Ask a Librarian service. Students can access this through the Ask Us Anything link on the Student Services page of the library site. SUNY Broome librarians monitor the service during normal library hours, and a network of college librarians cover it the rest of the day.

## Book a Librarian

Students can pick times to consult with librarians, either in-person or online. Schedule a time with the Book a Librarian form. This can be especially helpful for students who have research projects. Librarians can guide students to the most appropriate resources, from the library and on the web, for their assignments. This can save students time and effort, and achieve greater success.
