Hagerman – textbook report after each cycle, then feedback, but it becomes a cycle. CAI could be the committee. Are students alerted to when books come in? Student rep. indicated



that he never rec'd email. Do we have a sense about how many books are purchased at the store vs. online? There are book vouchers for some students who need to use the bookstore."
