Criminal Justice faculty and students demonstrated fingerprinting, dusting and lifting at the "Outta the Box Science that Rocks Fair," at the Roberson Science Center last Saturday.

Wes Warren, chair of Criminal Justice reported that Assistant Professor Kerry Weber, Instructor Faith Vavra Bergman, and Service Learning student Tiffany Evanchof fingerprinted hundreds of young children and then demonstrated how the fingerprint patterns could be dusted and lifted from soda cans and water bottles that the kids handled. The fair was sponsored by the Cornell Cooperative Extension to promote the interest of science to young children.

Warren reported that by the end of the day, everyone was covered in fingerprint powder. "The kids really enjoyed the ink and powder," Warren said.

(Town of Dickson) SUNY Broome Student, Raedelle Shaw has been named a 2013 Coca-Cola Leader of Promise by the Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society.

Raedelle, of Apalachian, NY, is one of only 73 students worldwide who received this honor and a \$1,000 scholarship.

The purpose of the Coca-Cola Leaders of Promise scholarship program is to provide new Phi Theta Kappa members with financial resources to help defray educational expenses while enrolled in a two-year college, and to encourage and develop leadership potential through participation in the honors society's programs. The Coca-Cola Leaders of Promise Scholarship is the Phi Kappa Theta's first scholarship program available to members for use during their enrollment at a community college.

"I believe Raedelle's appointment is very good news for the college," said Professor Irene Byrnes, SUNY Broome's Faculty Advisor to Phi Kappa Theta. "I congratulate her on her outstanding achievement."

Raedelle, a second-year Paralegal Studies major, is currently an Executive Board Member and Vice-President of Service for SUNY Broome's Phi Kappa Theta chapter, and a member of Alpha Beta Gamma – Business Honor Society.
