Dr. Curtis has been a member of the Biology faculty for SUNY Broome 10 years. She has recently begun collaborative Lyme disease research with Binghamton University that allows SUNY Broome students to gain research experience in this field. Dr. Curtis received the Distinguished Dissertation Award and Chancellor's Award for Student Excellence as a graduate student, and was awarded the SUNY Chancellor's Award for Excellence in Teaching last year. Dr. Phyllis O'Donnell earned her BS in Medical Technology from SUNY Stony Brook University. After working as a Medical Technologist in healthcare and as a Quality Control Analyst and Research Associate in industry, she returned to school and earned a PhD in Microbiology and Immunology from SUNY Upstate Medical University.
