Lynda Carroll awarded grant to collaborate with Mexico

Congrats to Lynda Carroll, Adjunct Professor in HPSS, who has been selected to teach a Collaborative Online International Learning (COIL) course in Fall 2015 as part of the SUNY COIL's Latin American Academy. This Academy is sponsored by a grant the SUNY COIL Center received from Santander Bank.

Her *Introduction to Archaeology* course will be paired with *Video y Arte Sonoro* (Visual and Sound Arts), a course taught by Prof. Jose Alfonso Guevara López from the University of Monterrey in Mexico. Carroll will emphasize how the material world (monuments, artifacts, and historical landscapes) "speak to us" in the present, while Guevara will emphasize how the arts are tied to contemporary social issues.

Lynda will travel to NYC to collaborate in person with her Mexican partner in June, and will travel to Mexico to meet the class sometime during the Fall semester. Their students will collaborate virtually on projects during the Fall semester.
