

SUNY Broome, Marywood ink new articulation agreement for Art Therapy program

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SUNY Broome art students will find it easy to transfer to Marywood University in Scranton, thanks to a new agreement between the two institutions.

Articulation agreements allow students to transfer all of their credits to a designated program at a four-year school, allowing for seamless transfers. SUNY Broome currently has such agreements in a wide range of programs with 27 different colleges and universities.

Approved this month, the new agreement links SUNY Broome's Associate in Science Visual Communication Arts degree to Marywood's Bachelor of Arts in Art Therapy. Students in the program will complete their first two years at SUNY Broome, and then finish their bachelor's degree in Marywood in an additional two years.

"This articulation agreement between Marywood University and SUNY Broome opens up a number of new opportunities for our students," said SUNY Broome Executive Vice President and Chief Academic Officer Francis Battisti. "The field of Art Therapy is a growing and has seen a steady increase in career opportunities over the past five years."

SUNY Broome's Visual Arts program is working on additional agreements with Marywood for art, education, illustration and photography. The two institutions also have an articulation agreement linking accounting degrees at both schools.



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
