SUNY Broome Professor heads to Mexico for COIL

Faculty member Jan McCauley of the History Philosophy and Social Science department will travel to Mexico this month as the recipient of a SUNY Collaborative Online International Learning (COIL) grant.

In September, Jan McCauley will travel for training in Cuernavaca, Mexico and then will visit the campus of LaSalle University in Mexico City with her collaborating partner, Alejandra Ortega Lagaspi. Their courses will be linked in Spring 2016. Professor McCauley will be teaching Latin American History, and Professor Ortega will be teaching Contemporary Problems of Communication. Together, they will look at *Club de Cuervos*, a Mexican program released worldwide on Netflix in August. It is the story of the infighting that happens when the owner of a beloved soccer team dies. The two classes will analyze cultural representations of Mexico within global culture.

Jan McCauley holds a Bachelors degree in Cultural Anthropology from SUNY Plattsburgh and a Masters in Latin American Studies from the University of Texas at Austin. She worked for many years for Prof. John W.F. Dulles, a biographer of Brazilian leaders,, as his liaison with publishers in Texas and Rio. She is in her seventh year of teaching at SUNY Broome.
